

The spring 2008 senate election took place on March 4 and 5. Votes were counted at 2:00 on March 6. There were contested elections in Arts and Sciences, the Honors College, Engineering and Computer Science and Libraries. The elections in Engineering and Computer Science and Libraries ended in a tie. In all other elections, the winners or the unopposed nominees will serve terms from 2008 to 2011.
